

### **Synopsis**

Maricarmen Graue (52) is a cello player; she plays with a rock band, as well as in a chamber orchestra. She is also a music teacher, a writer, and a marathon runner. She lives alone and is completely blind. She copes with her condition by having a biting sense of humor and being fiercely self-demanding. Swaying between laughter and a bare-boned meditation on the act of living, the documentary navigates the labyrinths surrounding a survivor.



#### **Director and Producer**

Sergio Morkin studied cinematography at the TCC (School of Contemporary Cinema), in Buenos Aires, Argentina. He also held several workshops in acting and directing actors.




He is director, producer and photographer of the documentary "Oscar" (2004), which obtained several international awards and an excellent response from the international press. He has been in Mexico since 2005, where he works as a director, producer and photographer. He also teaches documentary production and develops educational projects in different states of the country.

In 2012 he films "Los Ginger Ninjas filming Mexico" concludes. In 2014, he founded the production house Lupe & Hijos Films S.A de C.V, a company dedicated to the production of documentaries, which produced the acclaimed documentary "El Charro de Toluquilla" (2016) directed by José Villalobos. In 2019 he Produces and directs the documentary "Maricarmen" Throughout his career he has received support from several institutions: Alterciné (Canada), National Endowment for the Arts (Argentina), AECI (Spain), Tribeca Film Institute (USA), Gabriel Figueroa Fund (Mexico), ITDP (Mexico), IMCINE (Mexico), DOCSDF (Mexico), Cinépolis Foundation (Mexico), among others.

## Ricardo Garfias Photographer

Award winner of the Golden Frog at the Camerimage International Film Festival 2017 at the DOCUMENTARY FEATURES COMPETITION section, for the Feature Film Docuent Potentiae.



Ricardo is a cinematographer graduated from the Cinematographic Centre Training. He also has a degree in Social Communication from the Autonomous Metropolitan University of Mexico. His work has been selected four times at the INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL OF THE ART OF CINEMATOGRAPHY, CAMERIMAGE: 2010, 2014, 2015 and 2017, the most important film photography festival in the world. In 2015 the short film 400 suitcases, photographed by him, was nominated by the STUDENT ACADEMY AWARDS for the Best foreign short film award.

Since 2011 Ricardo works as cinematographer in Mexico and has 5 feature films in his career. In 2003 he also became a proffessional colorist for the next 10 years.



# José Villalobos Editor

He studied audiovisual media at the Audiovisual Media Center. He works as a director, photographer and documentary editor, as well as an animator and software programmer and multimedia installations.

His first documentary short film Oxxo, business or monopoly (2004) was presented at the Hamburg Ambulart festival in Germany in 2005, Videobrasil 2007 in Sao Paulo and at the 2007 Festival of Flowers in Madrid. He has worked as an editor of documentary feature films including The Ginger Ninjas, Ride Mexico, Faceless, Don Mammie Blue, as well as other documentary short films and commercial videos.

In 2016, he premiered his debut documentary El Charro de Toluquilla, a very successful work that won prizes at national and international festivals for best documentary film, such as FICG, FICMY, Sheffield Doc Fest, GIFF, GFCM, José Rovirosa Price.



## Nerio Barberis Sound Supervisor

With 64 films in his career, he has obtained ten nominations as best sound to the Ariel awards of which he was awarded the Ariel award in three opportunities He is an active member of the Mexican Academy of Arts and Sciences Cinematographs since 1998.

In 2019 he is awarded Ariel de Oro for his artistic career, the maximum recognition granted by the Mexican Academy of Art and Sciences Cinematographic
